The Senate Committee on Education held a meeting on Wednesday, September 24, 2014 at 12:00 p.m. in the Senate Hearing Room, Ground Floor, Boji Tower.

Senator Pavlov called the meeting to order at 12:12 p.m.

Senator Pavlov announced the order of business for the Education Committee:

Adoption of minutes from the September 17, 2014 meeting

SB 1074 Sen Jansen Higher education; community colleges; job training programs; revise statutory limits on number and aggregate amount of new training agreements and clarify definition of new job.
